

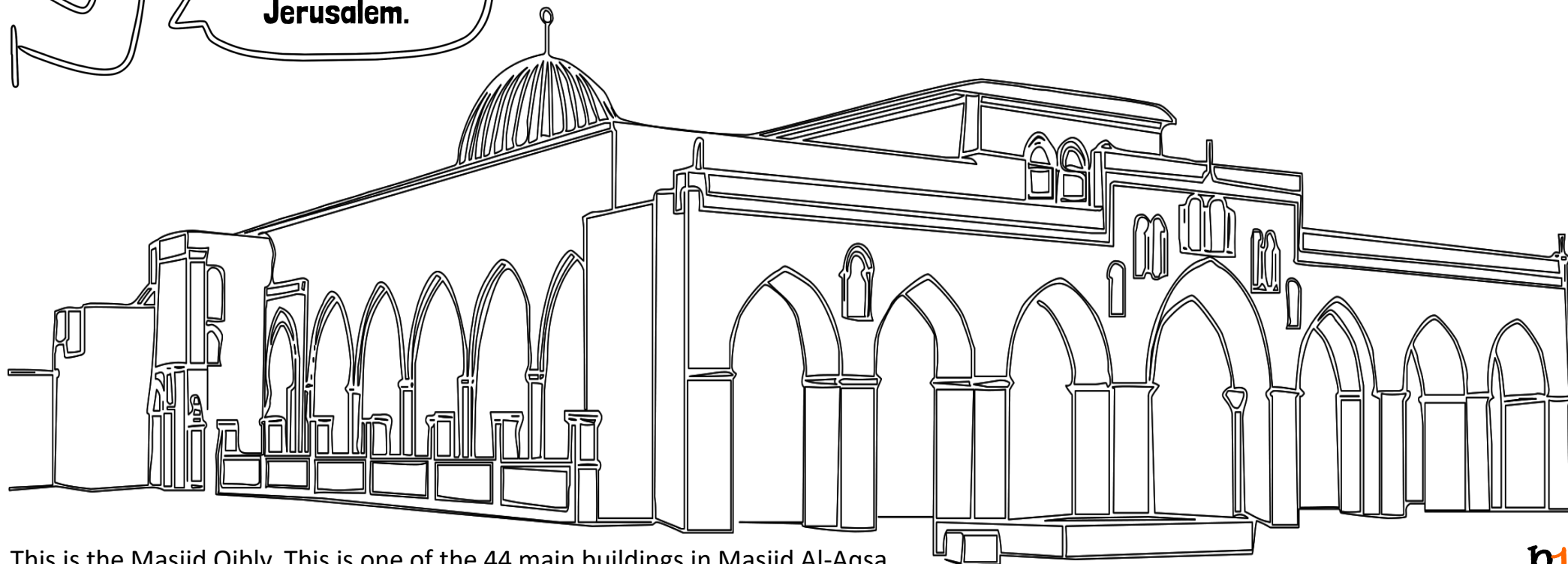


Day 1. Our Sacred Masjid Al-Aqsa

It is located in the city of Jerusalem.

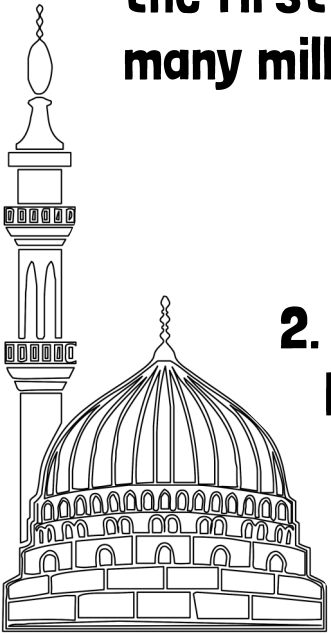
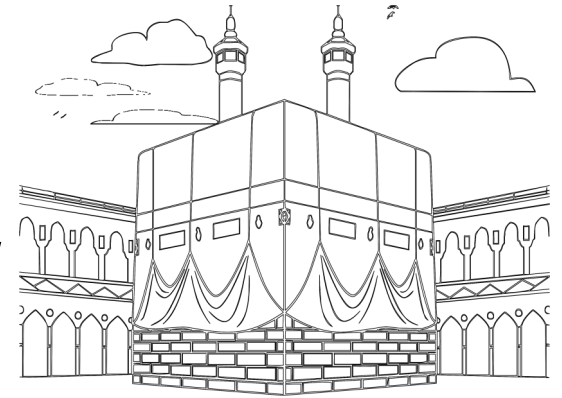

This is the Masjid Qibly. This is one of the 44 main buildings in Masjid Al-Aqsa

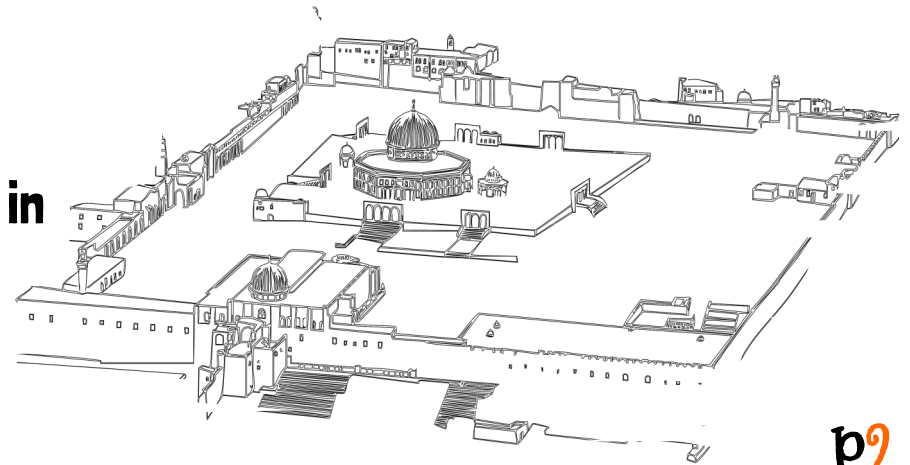
Important Masajid

1. **The Kab'ah** – The most sacred Masjid in the world. It was the first house built for the worship of Allah. It is visited by many millions of Muslims every year for Hajj and Umrah.



2. **Masjid Nabwi** – The second most sacred Masjid in the world. It is also known as the Prophet's Masjid and it is in Madina. It was built after the Hijra from Makkah to Madina.

3. **Masjid al-Aqsa** – The third most sacred Masjid in the world. It is the very place where all the prophets ﷺ prayed together during al Isra wal Miraj.



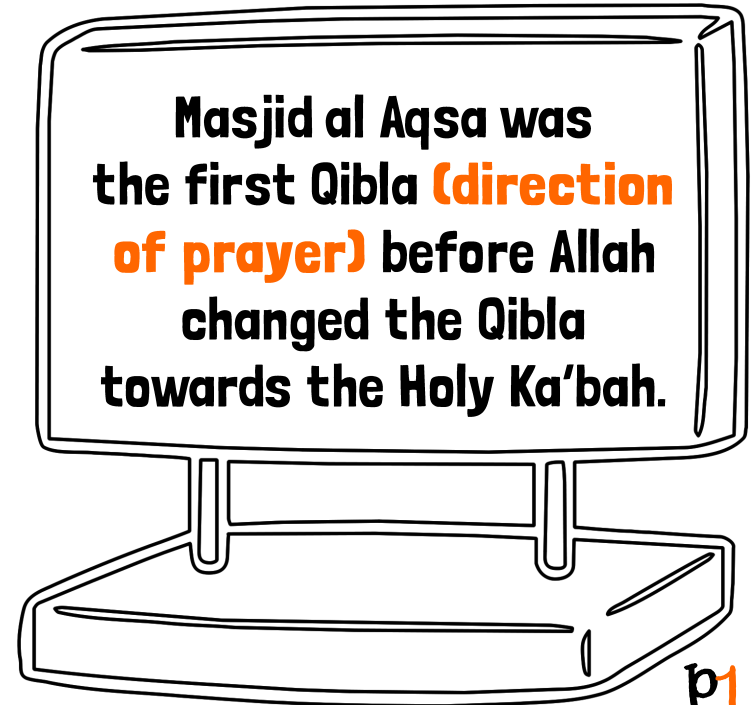

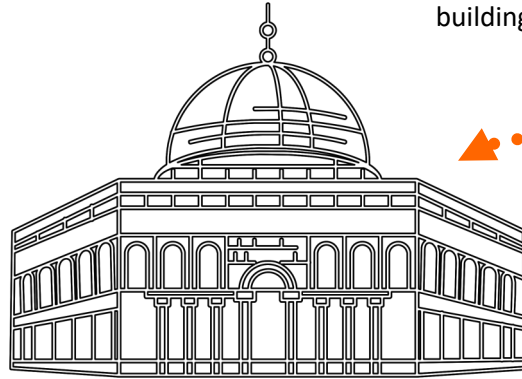
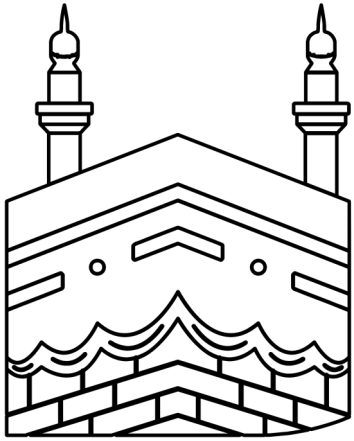

This is the **Dome of the Rock**, one of the buildings in Masjid Al-Aqsa



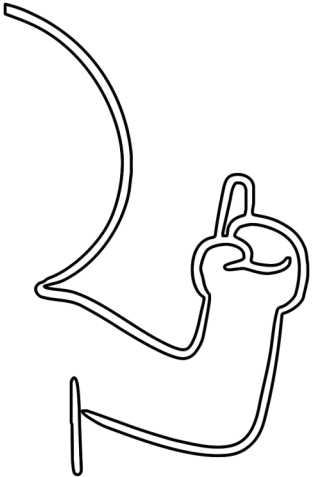
Masjid al Aqsa was the **second house of worship built on earth. It was built 40 years after the Holy Ka'bah.**



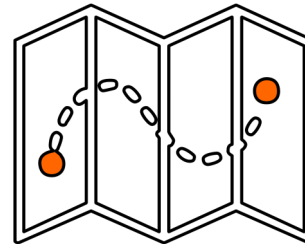
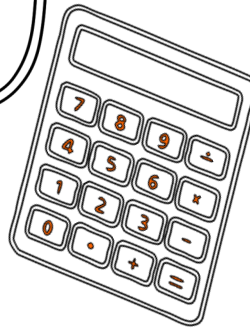
Did you know that reading Salah in masjid al Aqsa holds **500 times more reward! Amazing!**

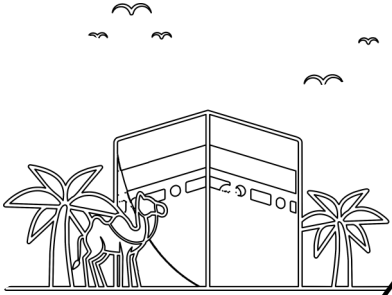


Our Prophet Muhammad ﷺ told us that there is great reward for wearing ihram and then going for Hajj or Umrah from Masjid Al-Aqsa.



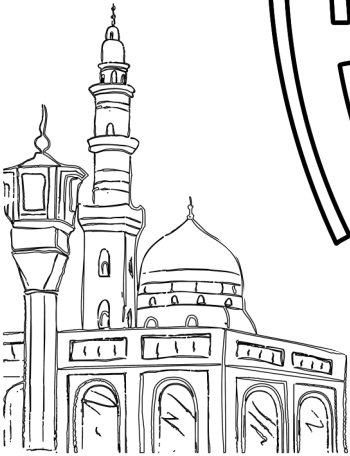

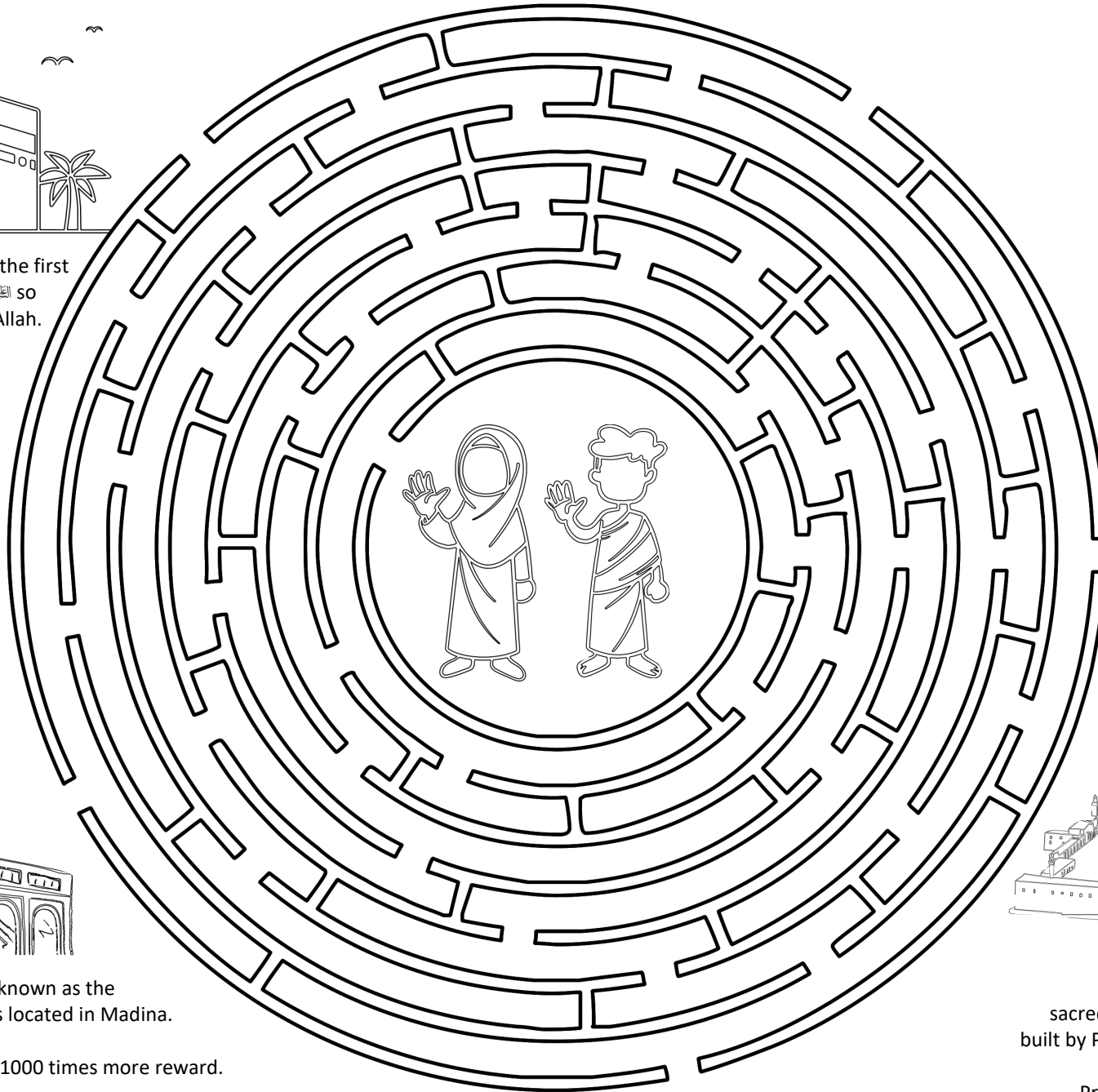
The Ka'bah - This was the first house built by Adam ﷺ so people could worship Allah.

Praying salah here has 100.000 times more reward.



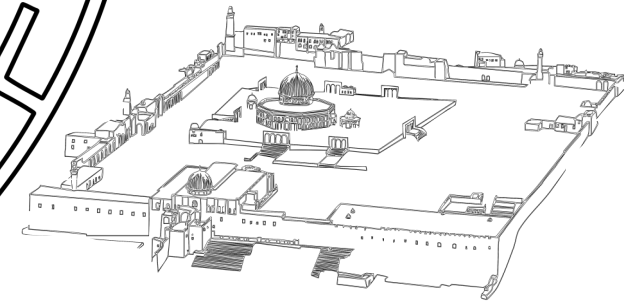
Masjid Nabwi - This is known as the Prophet's Masjid and is located in Madina.

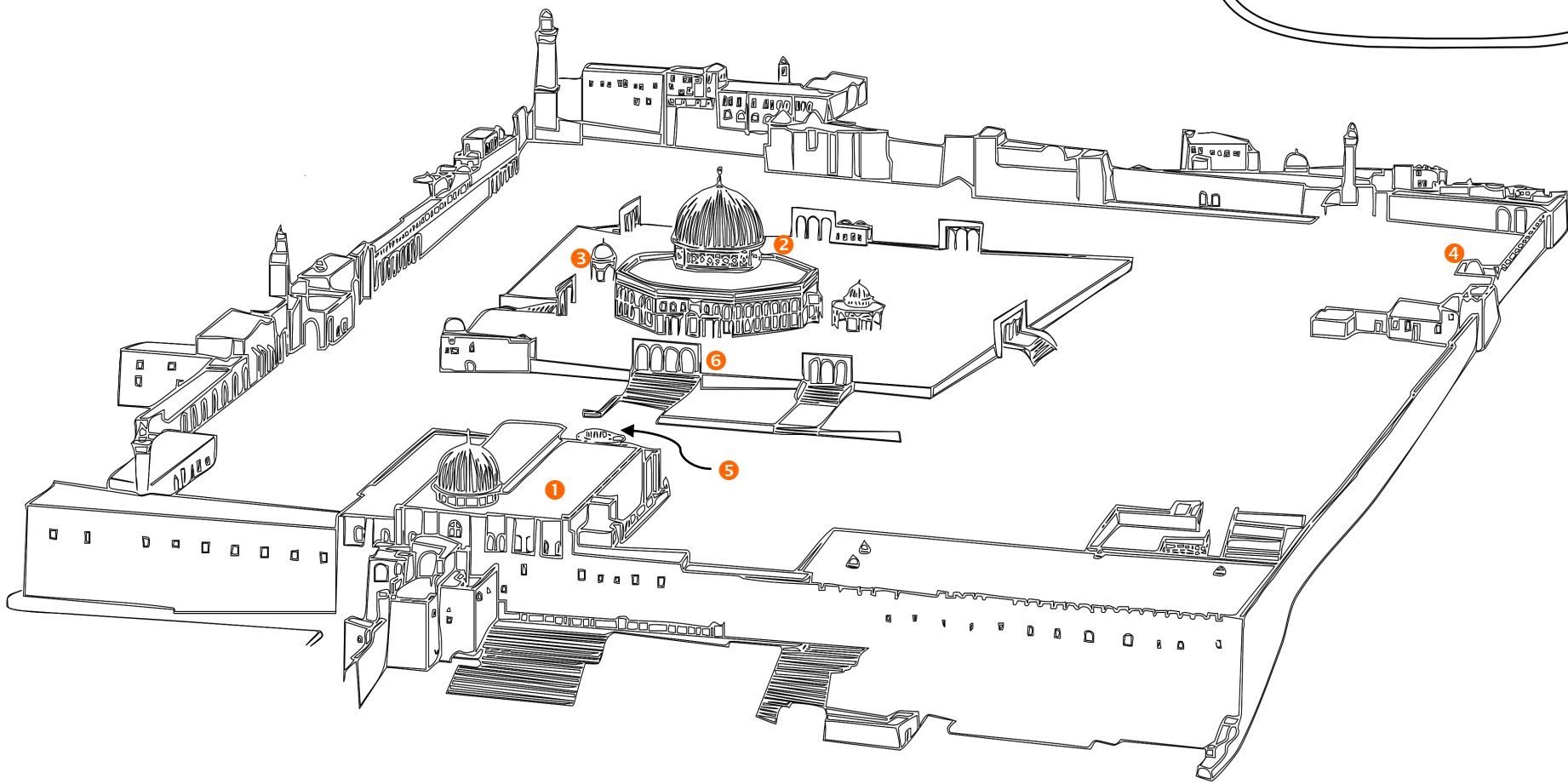
Praying salah here has 500 times more reward.

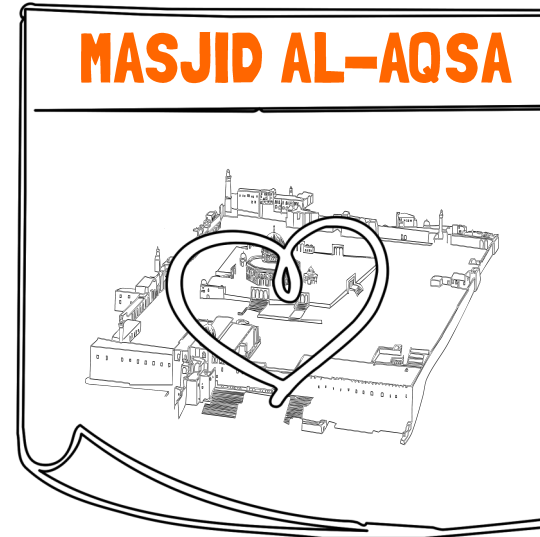

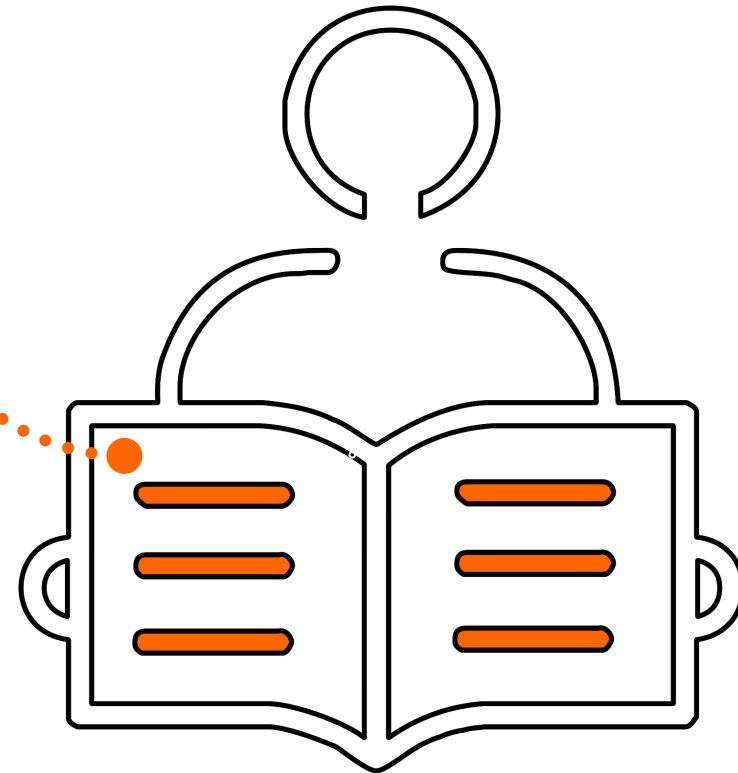
Did you know that there are **44** main buildings in Masjid Al-Aqsa?

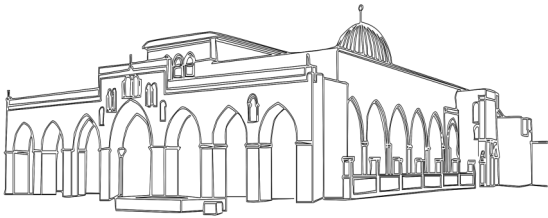

1 Qibly Masjid

This was the place Hadrat Umar رضي الله عنه and Muslims prayed when they came to Jerusalem. It had been abandoned and in ruins. For centuries, people threw their rubbish here. The Muslims cleared the site.

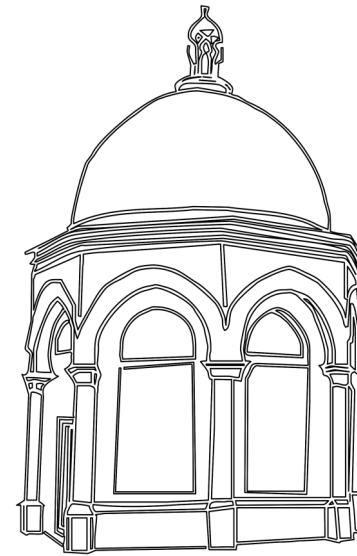


2 Dome of the Rock



Also known as Qubbat As-Sukhrah

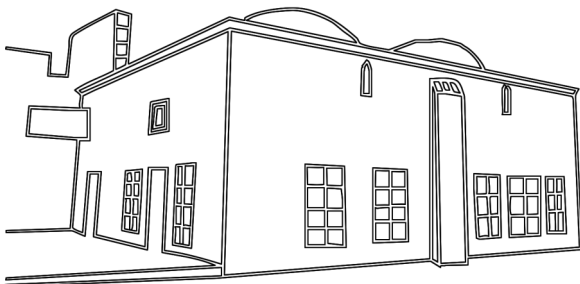
3 Dome of Ascension

This dome reminds us when our Prophet Muhammad ﷺ went into Heaven from this area.

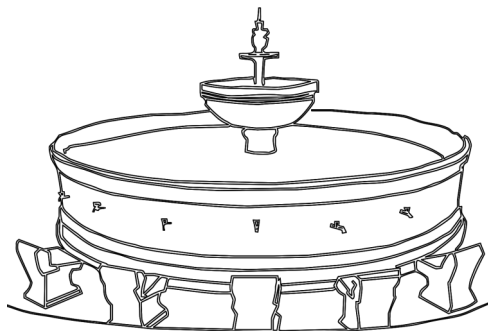
4 Sulaiman's Monument عليه السلام



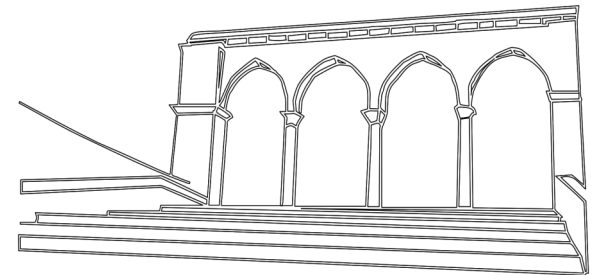

There are many fountains and wells in Masjid Al-Aqsa. This fountain is near Masjid Qibly where people can do wudhu.



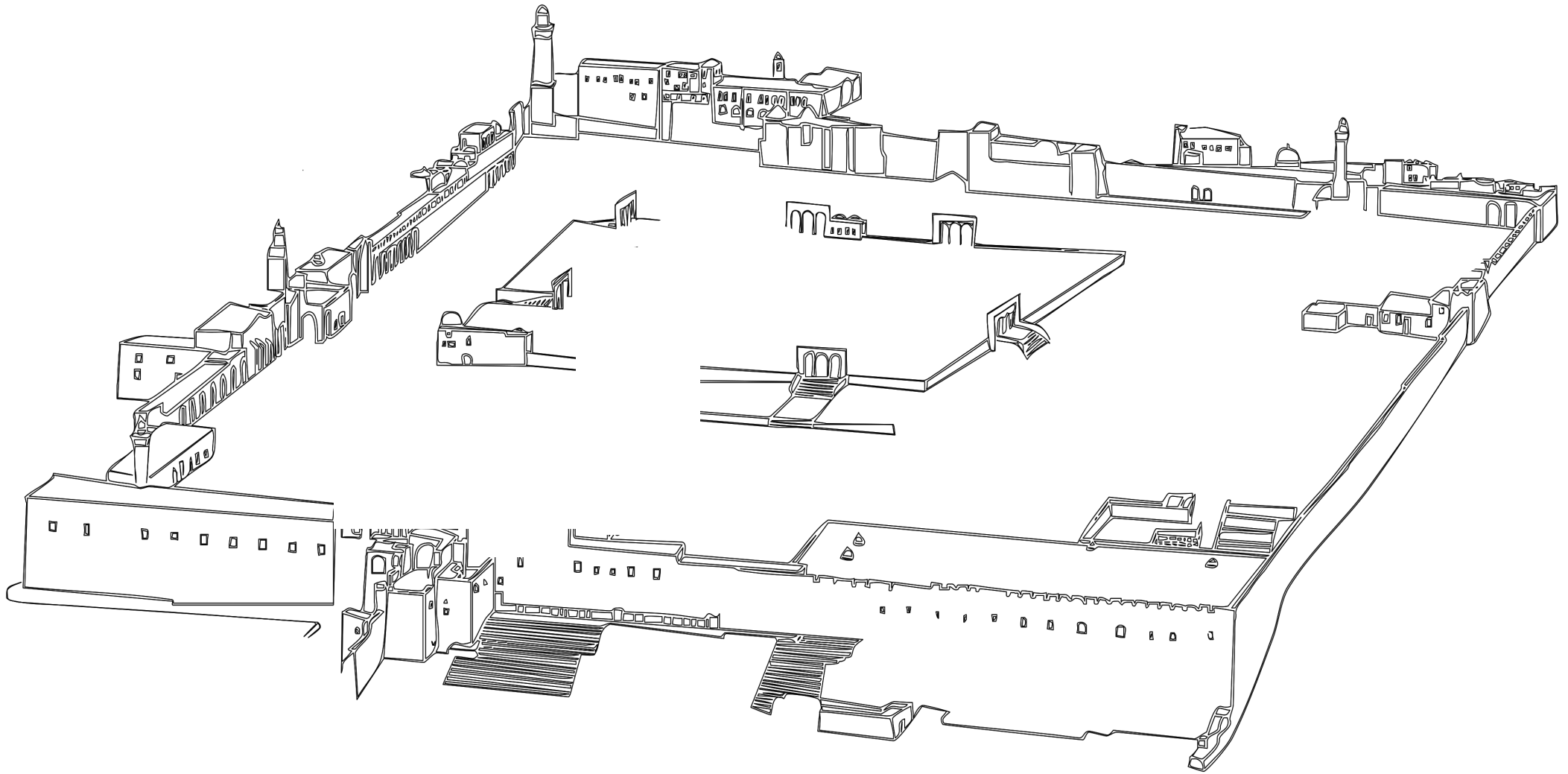
6 Archways

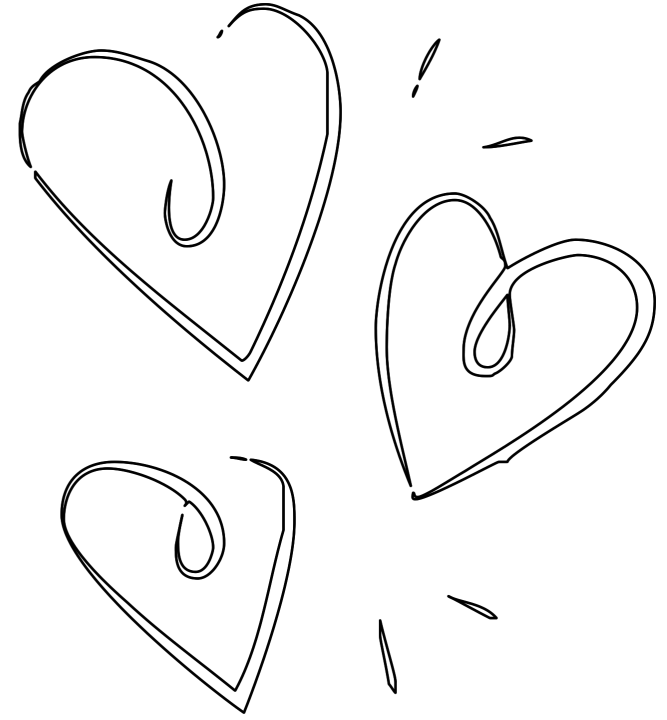
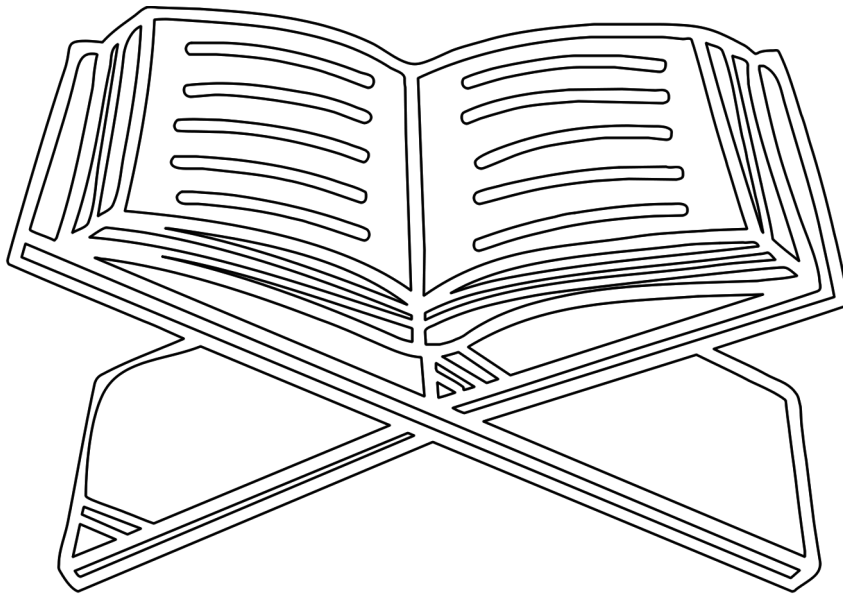

Prophet Zakariya عليه السلام was the imam of Masjid Al-Aqsa. He had a son called Prophet Yahya عليه السلام

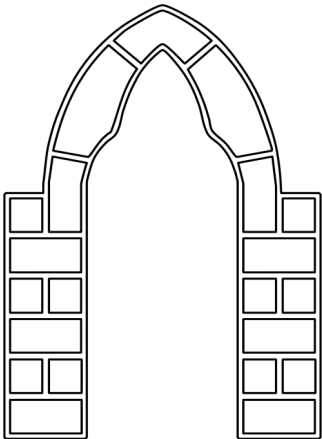
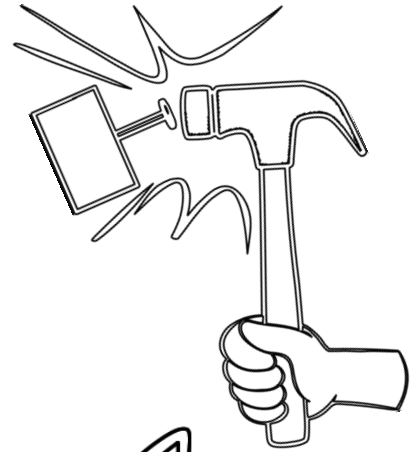

to Masjid Al-Aqsa in Jerusalem.

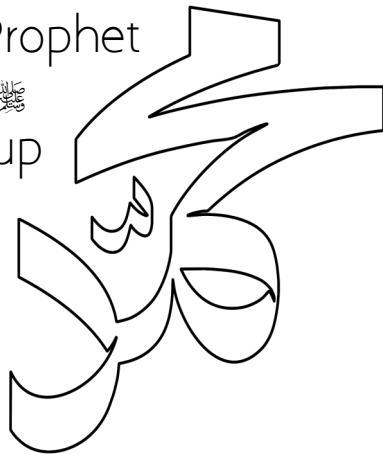


THE NIGHT JOURNEY

Our story begins with our Prophet Muhammad ﷺ was one night sleeping in the house of Umm Hani. This house was very near the Holy Kab'ah.



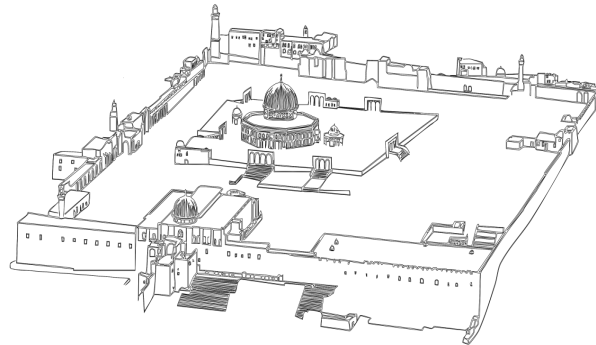
That night, Prophet Muhammad ﷺ was woken up by the Angel Jibrael عليه السلام.



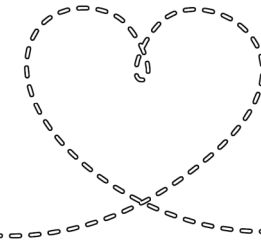
Angel Jibrael عليه السلام had brought with him a special animal from Jannah called a Buraq.



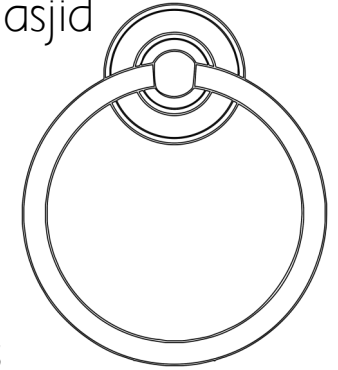
The Buraq looked like a horse with wings. It took our Prophet Muhammad ﷺ on an amazing journey to Masjid Al-Aqsa.



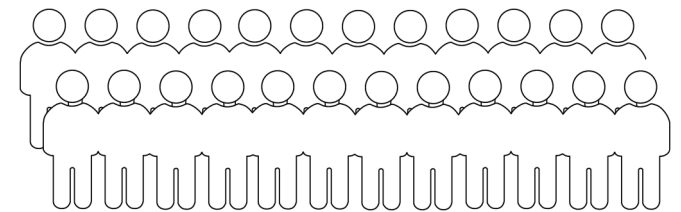
The Buraq travelled at a very high speed. Each stride of the Buraq was as far as the eye could see.



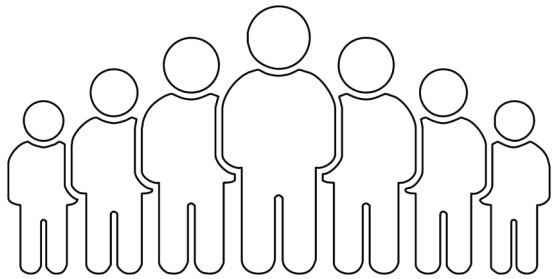
Once arriving in Jerusalem our Prophet Muhammad ﷺ tied the Buraq to a wall. He then entered Masjid Al-Aqsa.



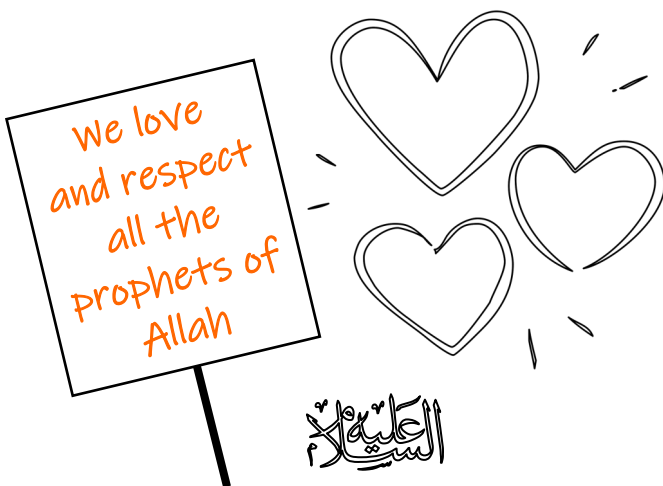
There were lots of people gathered in Masjid Al-Aqsa. A call to prayer was made and everyone stood in lines ready to pray.



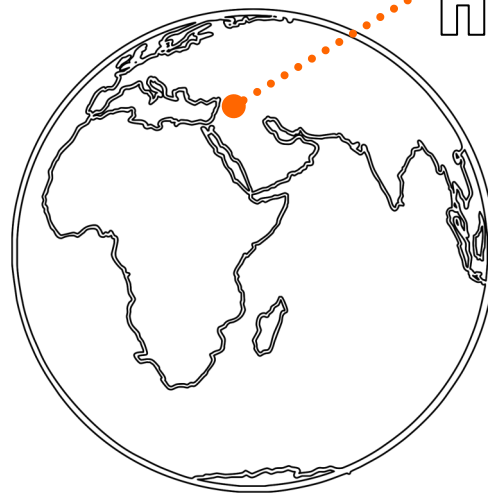
Angel Jibrael ﷺ asked the Prophet Muhammad ﷺ to lead the prayer which he did.

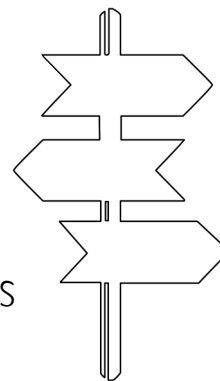

After this amazing event, Angel Jibrael ﷺ took Prophet Muhammad ﷺ on the next part of this incredible journey.



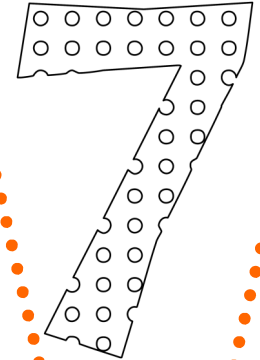
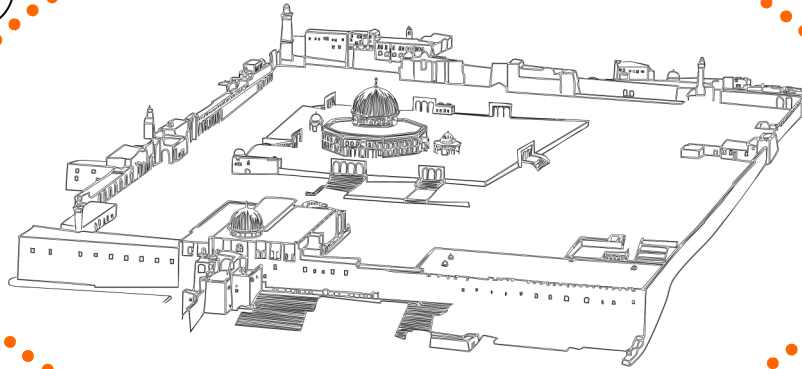
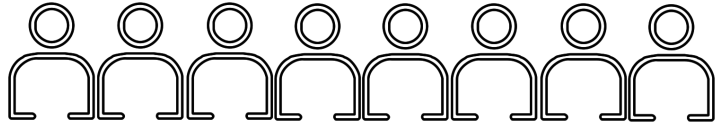
This is known as the Miraj. A journey through **the seven heavens** to meet with Allah.



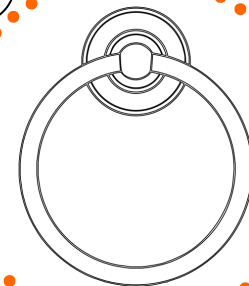
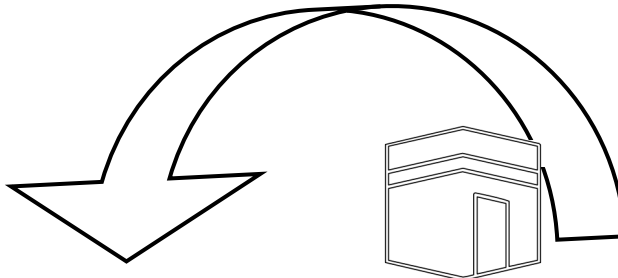
This was another amazing event. Sadly, we have run out of time. Let's keep this story for another day, In-Sha-Allah.
